

# **Lindsay Clancy iPhone iWatch Digital Data**

## **January 10, 2023**

- Searches involving prescription information and trazodone.
- Searches include trazodone with Benadryl, ibuprofen and Tylenol, plus medication-interaction questions.

## **January 12**

- 7:48 p.m. — Searches: “How quickly does Wellbutrin work for depression?”
- 7:49 p.m. — Search involving Lamictal for depression.
- 7:55 p.m. — Search involving Elavil for depression.

## **January 18**

- 10:25 a.m. — Searches “ketamine for suicidal ideation.”

## **January 19**

- 9:24 a.m. — Searches “symptoms of postpartum psychosis.”
- 9:30 a.m. — Searches “psychosis symptoms.”

## **January 23**

- An Apple Note originally created December 22 is last modified at approximately 10:23 a.m.
- Whiffen could not determine exactly what was changed; recovered earlier material indicated the note remained substantially similar.

## **January 24 — morning/daytime**

- Lindsay exchanges photographs and messages with her mother and Patrick.
- Patrick tells her, “You’re a good mama.”
- Lindsay responds with a heart-covered-face emoji.

**4:02 p.m.** Search related to children's MiraLAX.

**4:13 p.m.** Search for 3V takeout. Apple Maps is used to plan a route from the Clancy home to 3V.

**4:47 p.m.** CVS Pharmacy search.

**5:03 p.m.** iPhone records a flight of stairs being climbed; the watch does not record this flight.

**5:13 p.m.** Lindsay's iPhone is unlocked for the last time. Safari is used to search for Pedia-Lax.

**~5:15 p.m.** Lindsay messages Patrick: "Pedia-Lax liquid stool softener."

- Phone locks and is not unlocked again that evening.

**5:23:52 p.m.** Last Apple Watch heart-rate reading: 57 bpm.

- No subsequent heart-rate readings are transmitted to the phone.
- Whiffen could not determine why; possibilities included removal, power-off or depleted battery.

**~5:33 p.m.** Lindsay's iPhone records a flight of stairs.

- Whiffen clarified that by the time the flight is registered, the flight has already been completed.
- Patrick calls Lindsay; the call is unanswered.

**~5:34 p.m.** Lindsay's phone calls Patrick back.

- Call lasts approximately 14 seconds.
- The call could be returned from the lock-screen notification without unlocking the phone.

**~5:38 p.m.** Lindsay's iPhone records another flight of stairs.

- Whiffen explains that the 5:33–5:38 data represent two separate stair climbs, several minutes apart.
- This is the last flight-climb activity discussed for January 24.

**5:38–6:09 p.m.** No additional flights of stairs are recorded. Whiffen cannot determine from the absence of data what Lindsay was physically doing during this period.

**6:09 p.m.** Patrick calls Lindsay. Call goes unanswered.

## **January 25**

- Health data later show movement/distance.
- Reddington points out Lindsay was hospitalized and could not have generated that movement herself.
- Whiffen explains the data could have originated from the iPhone itself; an operating phone records movement regardless of who is carrying it.
- The prosecution notes police were transporting Lindsay's phone after it was seized.
